ZEFFY- ON LINE GIVING

LOG has changed the platform we use to process electronic payments. We were using Kindred and were recently notified that in addition to the regular batch charges, we were going to be charged \$9.99 fee per month. For the entire year of 2022, we paid \$164 in Kindred fees. For six months in 2023, we have already paid \$147. Glenda just received another notice of an increase to \$19.99/ month in addition to the other fees. Because of this, the Church Council looked at alternative platforms to process our electronic payments. Zeffy was chosen since there are no fees to you or to the Church. Zeffy is a non-profit organization that was formed to help other non-profit organizations.

If you would like to give on our website, just click the "Give Now Lamb of God Lutheran Church" button and then click on "Give to Lamb of God Church Now." From there, you can choose a one-time donation, monthly donation or a yearly donation. There are set amounts you can select or you can type in any amount. On your first donation, you'll have to enter your checking account information or a debit or credit account number. The Zeffy website uses Stripe to verify your checking account or credit card information. You can also donate via Apple Pay / Google Pay. Each time you make a donation to LOG, you will also be asked to make a donation to Zeffy. You do not have to do this but can if you would like to support Zeffy as well. You will receive an email receipt with each donation. If you have any problems or need any help setting up your Zeffy account, please see Wendy or Glenda.

Subject: Closure of the Luke Clinic Flint Location

Dear Friends of The Luke Clinic, I hope this letter finds you in good health. It is with a heavy heart that I write to inform you about the difficult decision we have had to make regarding the closure of the Luke Clinic in Flint. This decision has not been made lightly and has come after careful consideration of the circumstances we find ourselves facing. For the last two years The Luke Clinic Flint has been dedicated to providing vital medical services to some of the most vulnerable in our community. Our team of committed medical professionals and volunteers has strived to uphold the values of quality, and compassionate, relationship-based care. However, it is with deep regret that I must inform you that we are forced to close our doors due to significant staffing shortages and financial constraints. The shortage of qualified medical personnel has become a critical issue for us. Despite our best efforts to recruit and retain skilled professionals, the challenges in hiring and maintaining a full staff have become insurmountable. This shortage has not only placed immense pressure on the existing staff but also leaves us with insufficient staff to provide the quality of care we can provide to our patients. Furthermore, our financial situation has reached a point where sustaining both clinic's operations has become increasingly difficult. As a free medical clinic, we have heavily relied on grants, donations, and community support to cover our operational costs. Unfortunately, despite these efforts, we have faced persistent deficits this summer that have drained our resources and made it impossible to maintain the standard of care that our patients deserve. We understand the impact our closure will have on the community we serve, and it is with deep regret that we must take this step.

We are exploring options to ensure our patients can transition to other healthcare providers smoothly, and that their medical needs continue to be met during this time of transition. Patients without insurance will be offered transportation assistance to allow them to be seen at our Detroit Clinic location. We are currently evaluating our staffing levels across all locations, looking at roles, responsibilities and identifying gaps or areas where we need additional staffing and/or volunteers. We have taken into account increasing patient volumes in Detroit, services currently offered and operational requirements. Our review of staffing levels and performance metrics indicated a compelling need to move resources to Detroit based on patient feedback, the need for efficiency improvements and increased demands. Once we have stabilized our staffing and finances we will look at reopening our Flint Clinic. During the time that we are closed we will act as a clearinghouse for patients who call to initiate care. We will ensure that we continue to work with local pregnancy care centers and other agencies to help support women and children as they seek medical care. We understand that this news comes as a shock to many of you. We are extremely grateful for your financial support over the last two years and sincerely hope that you will choose to continue to support our work during this difficult time.
