PRIVATE HOME COMMUNION:

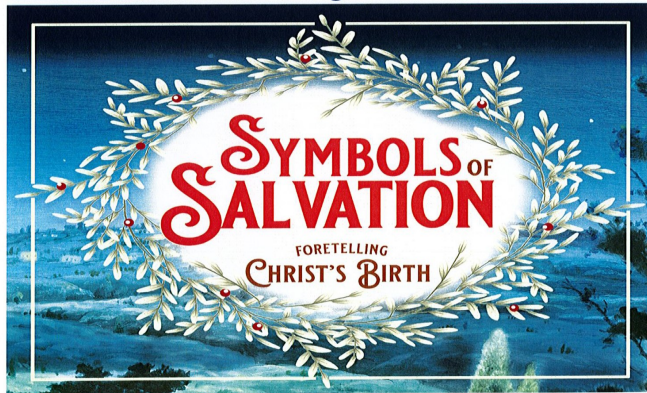
