ZEFFY– ON LINE GIVING

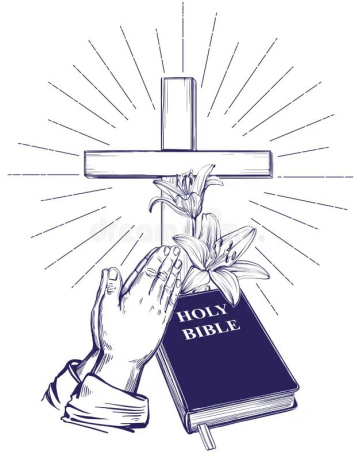

LifeLight Worship; Bible Study on Ezekiel

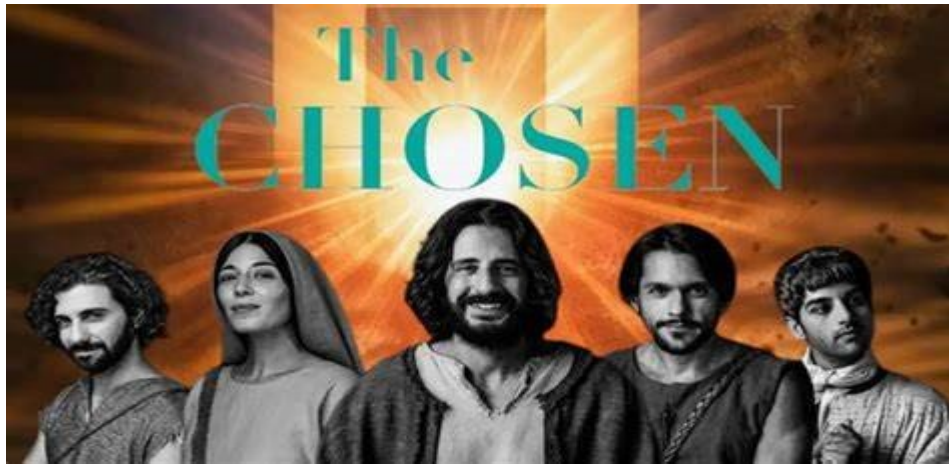

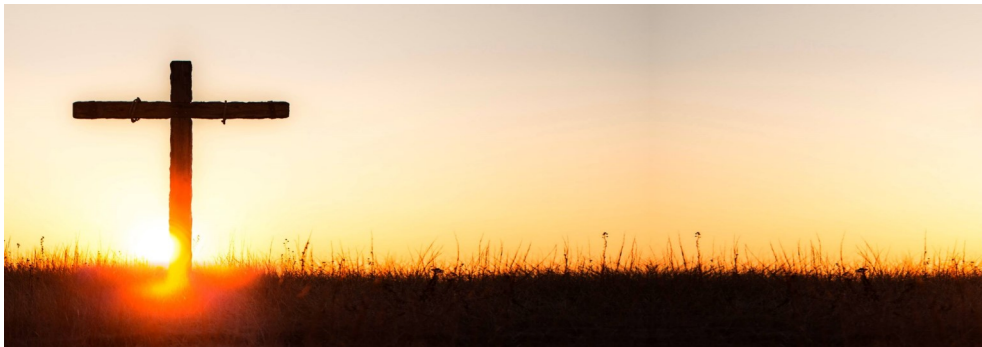

Celebrating New Life

We've been blessed to see new life in the faces of our newborn babies. Nothing compares to the day a patient walks into the clinic holding her car seat with her newborn snuggled inside. We all gather around and lean over to get a closer look. Cries of delight erupt from our lips and our patient smiles with deep-seated joy. New Fathers look on with pride – everything stops for a moment. We soak in the beauty of this precious new life. The possibilities, the excitement, the reward for nine months of waiting. We thank God that He has sought to bring this wonderful young Mom to our clinic so that we can continue to journey alongside of her through this first year of life. Encouraging, educating, cheerleading and believing.



Community Doulas

Do you know what community-based doula does and why they are so important for our Moms?

I am thrilled to share with you that we are partnering with wonderful a team of community doulas to serve our Moms. These amazing women meet with our patients during their pregnancy, attend their births and meet them in the weeks to months following the birth.



They develop a strong relationship with our Moms due to the fact that the doula is typically their only support. During their visits, these doulas discuss topics ranging from birth and breastfeeding to bonding with the baby, something that many of us take for granted. They also tend to collaborate with other community programs to provide greater support and resources for their clients. Studies have proven that birth outcomes improve when doulas are part of a Moms care team.

A doula commits to support a Mom during her labor and never leaves her side without providing alternative doula support. This involves long hours away from her own family and requires a dedicated and committed person to serve in this way. As of this year, Medicaid recognizes this value, and doulas can be compensated through Medicaid for their time.

Many of our patients don't have insurance and therefore the doulas for these clients do not receive any reimbursement. I am sure you will join me in recognizing the commitment, service and value that they provide our Moms.

A GREAT MONTH AT ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN—MICHIGAN

April 23 marked the fifth anniversary of operations of Orphan Grain Train—Michigan in Sebewaing. April was also occasion for sending a major distribution of humanitarian goods with the Gospel to ODP Jesuitas del Peru, in Lima, Peru, a cargo currently passing through the Panama Canal. Also during April a large domestic shipment of clothing and medical items was delivered to Manna from Heaven, a Christian charity serving the disadvantaged in Appalachia at Myra, Kentucky.
